
## God Has Two Questions to Ask





You may have checked **several** answers. That's why there is a second question.

The second question is a little longer, and you should only check **ONE** answer...


(Read them all before you make your one selection.)

#2 If you stood before God at the entrance of Heaven and God asked you, "Why should I let you into My Heaven?" (and you could only give ONE answer) what would you say?

Remember to read **all** of the following list **before** making one, and only **one**, selection...

Did you check one? There is only one right answer. Biblically speaking (and God wrote the Book on it!), salvation is of the Lord.



The answers to the second question can be grouped into two categories: (1) What Man Did, and (2) What God Did. Only one answer would be under group (2) What God Did, and that is the only correct biblical answer because salvation is of the Lord. The only correct answer is, "I've trusted Christ, who paid for my salvation in full." Even, "I've trusted Jesus as my

Savior and..." is not correct. Why? Because it adds man's works.

It is not <u>our</u> works, but His that saves us. It is not our righteous acts, but His righteousness that gets us into Heaven. God paid for our salvation in the righteous death of His Son, Jesus Christ. The wages of sin is death (separation from God, who is holy). Christ, in His death, provided us with the only righteous payment possible. The Bible says, "For by grace are you saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast.", Ephesians 2:8, 9.
